THE FOUR LAST THINGS

This last Sunday after Pentecost ends our annual liturgical journey through the spiritual history of the world which begins anew each year with the First Sunday of Advent.

For this reason, the prayers and readings of today's Mass turn our attention to **the four last things—death, judgement, heaven, hell**—and especially to the second coming and final judgment, **when Christ will return with power and majesty to judge the living and the dead.**

This Sunday's Gospel reading is one of the more powerful and memorable readings of the whole Church year at Mass in the extraordinary form (though it appears nowhere in the newer ordinary form lectionary):

*"When you shall see the abomination of desolation
For as lightning cometh out of the east, and appeareth even
to the west, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be . .
. . . . And immediately after the tribulation of those days,
the sun shall be darkened and then shall appear the
sign of the Son of man in heaven and they shall see
the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with much
power and majesty" (Matthew 24:15-35).*

Music for today's Mass, November 22

Here are some of the proper texts—those that change with every Sunday or solemnity—to be sung today:

Introit: How worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and divinity and wisdom and strength and honor. To him belong glory and power for ever and ever. (Revelation 5:12; 1:6)

Responsorial psalm: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. (Psalm 23:1-2)

Offertory: Ask of me, and I will give you the nations for an inheritance and the ends of the earth for your possession. (Psalm 2:8)

Communion: Amen I say to you: in as much as you have done it to one of the least of these, my brethren, you have done it to me. Come, O blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the beginning of the world. (Matthew 25:4, 6)

Recessional hymn: Jesus shall reign

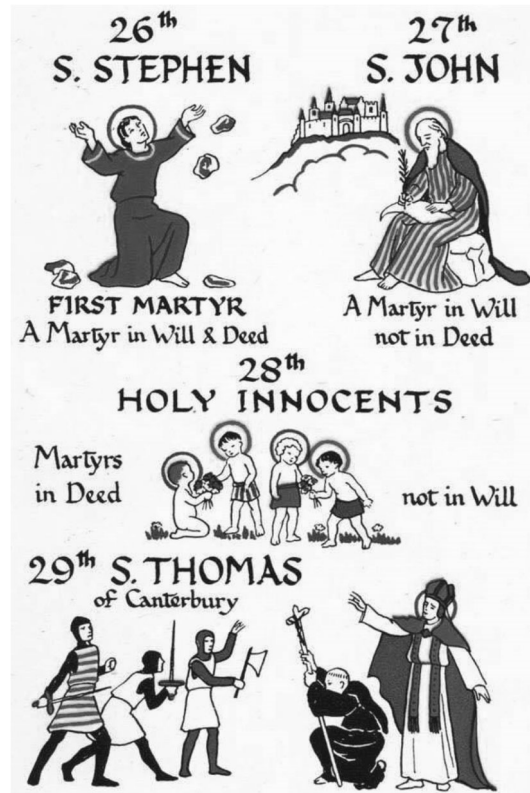
**Meeting regarding the Catholic Ordinariate
on December 12**

A meeting will be held at 6 p.m. **Saturday, December 12**, in the parish basement at Holy Ghost to gauge interest in a new alternate Mass liturgy from the Book of Divine Worship.

The Divine Worship Mass is part of a larger structure within the Catholic Church called the Ordinariate, which was erected by Pope Benedict XVI in 2013. The idea of the Ordinariate is for the Catholic Church to have a canonical and liturgical structure that would serve as an easy bridge for Protestants (especially but not limited to Anglicans) to enter the Catholic Church. The service retains the beautiful “patrimony” of the English Church and the *Book of Common Prayer*.
